M4K Lynchburg is a volunteer-run organization that spun off of M4K Richmond in 2014 with the goal of rais-

Drone Profile

Drones A Nice Addition to Our Services



Ty Brady, a licensed surveyor with the Blacksburg H&P surveying department, has been a photographer most of his life. So when he discovered that close range photogrammetry combines surveying and photography, it became another hobby of his. Unfortunately small drones were not around fifteen years ago, so this limited what could be done. Just over a year ago with the quality of drones

continually getting better, it finally became possible to use drones to get the high resolution images required for surveying without breaking the bank.

A drone with specialized software can be used to create a topographic survey that could be used for civil engineering design. This can be done by taking hundreds to a few thousand pictures in a grid pattern and using special software along with precise

to create the topographic survey. It can really save a lot of time in the field to use a drone if there are not too many trees and the grass/brush is not too tall. A drone could fly an area in a day that might take a week or more for a two person field crew to locate. These savings could be passed on to the client along with other deliverables not possible with traditional surveying methods such as a high resolution orthographic image, a point cloud and even a 3D photographic model should that be needed.
